2018 - 2019 INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENTS

\$ 75,000	Complete an independent engineering assessment of the Liverpool Waterfront with a goal of eliminating or reducing future flooding problems for Municipal lands and adjacent businesses.
\$ 7,500	Increase safe use of sidewalks by those with reduced visibility painting splays of all sidewalks in Liverpool, Brooklyn, Caledonia and Milton.
TBD	When sidewalk materials near intersections need to be replaced, all sidewalks will have tactile paving replace current surfaces.
\$ 1,000	Review options and materials and prepare potential designs and costs to design, manufacture and install a sidewalk railing on one side of the Liverpool bridge.
\$ 15,000	Work with the Province of NS to plan for a new location and financing arrangements for a replacement facility for Hillview Acres to ensure the long term provision of this service locally.
\$ 885,000	Replace all water and sewer lines on Union Street, Liverpool (from Main St. to Church St.) and Mill Lane.
\$ 798,000	Continue expansion of sewer and water system in Brooklyn from Markland Avenue to Brooklyn Waterfront Park, including pump station, to help replace dysfunctional on site systems.
\$ 25,000	Complete design work for sewer and water line replacement for Waterloo Street, Liverpool (from School St. to Liverpool Harbour, including James St., William St., Bartling Ave., and Enos Collins Lane).
NO COST	Request that Queens Place Emera Centre Board of Directors undertake a comprehensive review of fees, programs, and policies to ensure the facility is maximizing its potential.
TBD	Install an appropriate power system on the Liverpool waterfront for use by festivals, events, and vendors.
TBD	Upgrade internet service at Queens Place Emera Centre and wireless connections, to allow for better mobile internet access, webcasting, and TV broadcasting.
NO COST	Research ownership and work with NS Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal to create a plan to stabilize and rehabilitate Hunts Point Beach to mitigate flood risks and Route 3 road damage.
NO COST	Review, consult with local residents, and develop a preliminary plan and costing, if appropriate, to connect 13 properties on Lakeview Road and Highway 8 to the Caledonia Sewer system.
