The 8th International Ukulele Ceilidh will be held at the Best Western Plus Hotel and Conference Center in Liverpool on October 4 and 5, 2019.

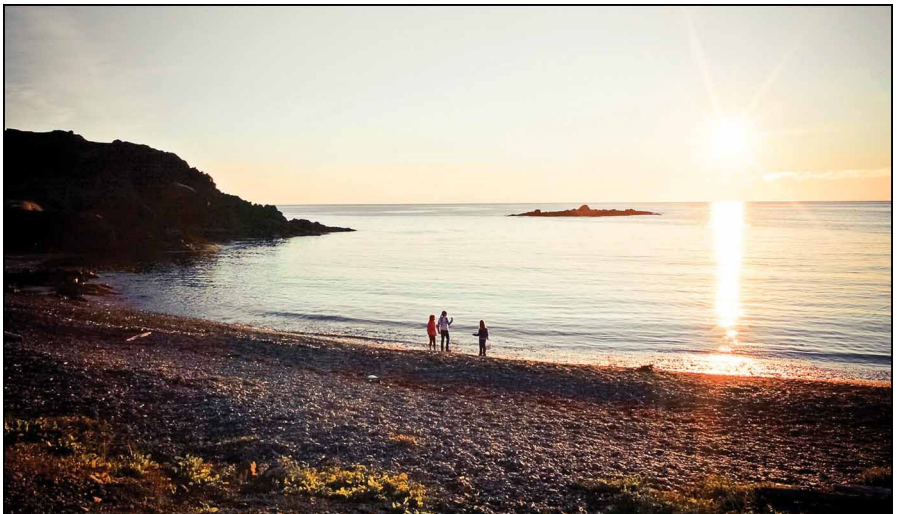

As one of the oldest agricultural fairs in the province, the Queens County Fair is celebrating its 138-year history!

For five days during the third week in September, Caledonia comes alive with hundreds of participants, spectators, exhibits, and animals. The Queens County Fair is a celebration of traditions and the agricultural roots of the County, in a family and community oriented event.

The Grand Parade is a must-see, when the main street hosts the livestock, community groups, and businesses in a noisy, colourful celebration. Huge draft horses and docile powerful oxen compete to drag the heaviest weight, whilst horse riders sprint around poles and barrels against the clock. Livestock judges look over everything from rabbits to goats to cattle, especially keenly contested between the local youth 4H club.

There's a music stage with a constant variety of acts, and a main building display of competitions of home grown fruit and vegetables, home-made bread, cakes, preserves, and arts and crafts. Food is supplied by a variety of vendors including regular breakfast, lunch, and dinner menu at the main dining hall. Queens County Fair is a great way to experience our heritage, celebrating the turning of another season on a warm Fall evening, sounds of livestock and music filling the air - just like folks have been doing for more than a century.

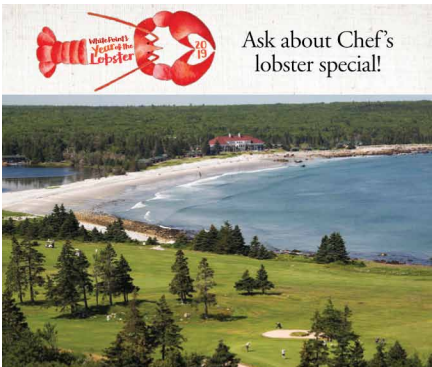

THE BROOKLYN MARINA

Queens Recreational Boating Association was formed in 1995 and incorporated as a non-profit society. The marina's clubhouse, docks and other facilities were member built and are maintained by members. Annual dock fees are \$250 - \$400 and the annual social membership fee is \$20. Boat ownership is not a requirement for membership.

The marina has 60 member dock spaces and a 300 foot visitor dock with seven foot low tide water depth for visiting boats. Moorings are also available. Visiting boat services include 15 & 30 amp power, water, bathroom and shower facilities and free WiFi.

The marina is located in a sheltered bay three miles from the headlands providing easy access for boats travelling the coast. The marina is adjacent to Brooklyn Waterfront Park and on the Lighthouse Route 3 close to the community of Liverpool. Apart from the



marina's boating related activities, the marina strives to be a local community facility with economical membership fees. The clubhouse is used for marina social events and operational activities.

The marina has a canteen which allows for canteen services and some dinner functions during the summer.

SURFING

The Atlantic coastline of Nova Scotia is known for its world-class surfing spots and the shoreline of Queens County is no exception. With a multitude of points, reefs and beach breaks the local surf community welcomes surfers from near and far. Late August through to mid November is when one considers water temperature and wave activity at its best. Check out www.magicseaweed.com for the Nova Scotia surf forecast.



BIRDING

Nature abounds in Queens County, and provides many opportunities for ornithologists. The diversity of habitat is key to why Queens County is so rich in bird life. Coastal areas (beaches, dunes, estuaries), agricultural forests, wetlands and lakes each provide a wide variety of habitat for birds.

Around 150 species of birds are recorded annually in Queens County. That water connection is so vitally important. The many lakes, bogs, wetlands and rivers provide edge habitat at the transition between forest and water, these edges generally have higher density and are a great place to spot birds.

Western Head lighthouse is a great place to spot seabirds and seaducks and alcids including Black guillemot, Black-legged kittiwakes, murrelets, Razorbills, gulls (7 species), petrels, shearwaters, puffins, fulmars, Northern gannets jaegers, and terns.

Port L'Hebert and Port Joli bays are

nationally important bird areas and designated Migratory Bird Sanctuaries. They are important for Canada Geese and many species of ducks.

In winter, the calmer waters of Port Mouton Bay and "The Pond" are a great place to see many species of diving and dabbling ducks including Common eider, Black duck, Mallard, Long-tailed Ducks, Common, Red Breasted, and Hooded Mergansers, Buffleheads, Scoters among many others.

Beaches in Queens County (Summerville, White Point, St. Catherines River), provide opportunities to view a variety of shorebirds during spring and fall migration periods including Dunlins, Semipalmated sandpipers, Sanderlings, Willets, and various species of plovers. Freshwater lakes in Queens County host a variety of species including Bald Eagles, Osprey (also nesting along Highway 8 in several places on power poles), Spotted sandpipers, Wood ducks, Ring-necked ducks, kingfishers,

American Bittern and Common terns. In winter the Ipswich sparrow (which only breeds on Sable Island) can be seen in the grassy dunes behind beaches.

McGowan Lake hosts a roost of Chimney swifts which gather by the hundreds at dusk to enter their roosting chimney in a tornado like formation in spring and late summer. They arrive the first week of May and have chicks, raise them and are gone by the first week of September to return to the Amazon Basin in South America.

Kejimikujik National Park (inland) is a great place to see a variety of forest birds as well as their famous Common Loons. Great places to observe warblers include the Eel Weir road, Grafton Lake and along the many

trails in the park. There are more than 55 species of songbirds in the park in summer along with many other forest birds. The “morning chorus” of song is very busy and almost overwhelming in many places in the park. Other species that are fairly unique to the park in Queens County include Yellow-bellied flycatchers, Eastern kingbirds, Common nighthawk.

This variety of landscapes means that birdwatchers have plenty of choice to match their areas of birding interest.

Geocaching

The Queens Crown Passport is your gateway to exploring Queens County via geocaching. We invite you to travel throughout the county visiting places you may or may not have been before, picking up caches along the way.

Pick and choose which caches you'd like to find. Looking for traditional caches? We've got those. Want to solve a puzzle? There are a few of those too! If multi-caches are your preference, we've got three of those for you as well! We've even got a letterbox cache!

We have placed 35 caches with varying degrees of difficulty and terrain levels for you to find. If you find 30 or more geocaches, you'll be rewarded with a unique trackable geocoin designed especially for this passport. If you find 20-29 caches, you'll receive a trackable button. See the rules to find out how to claim your reward.

USING YOUR PASSPORT

The Queens Crown Passport consists of 35 geocaches located throughout the County. All geocaches are officially registered on geocaching.com. Participants will need to be registered on geocaching.com to retrieve the coordinates and other

location information. Registration is free.

Each geocache has a code printed on the inside of the cache container's lid. As you find the geocaches, record the code next to the cache number on your Queens Crown Passport and log the cache on geocaching.com.

A cultural landscape within the UNESCO World Heritage Site

With 381 square km of rolling hills and interconnected waterways, Kejimikujik is a gentle wilderness where generations of families have canoed, camped, and connected with nature for years. Its diverse woodlands and wetlands are bursting with wildlife, creating a unique biodiversity hotspot like no other. Keji is home to 178 species of birds as well as mammals, and the greatest diversity of reptiles and amphibians in Atlantic Canada.

Not only does Keji protect a sampling of the Acadian forest, it also preserves and presents a unique Mi'kmaw cultural landscape, celebrating the presence of the Mi'kmaq since time immemorial and providing a space for Mi'kmaq to share

their stories and traditions today.

One way the rich Mi'kmaw heritage can be explored is through rock carvings known as petroglyphs. Keji is home to the largest collection in eastern North America. Daily guided tours during July and August provide visitors access to areas that are normally restricted due to their cultural sensitivity. Traditional encampment areas and ancient canoe routes also contribute to Keji's cultural landscape and designation as a National Historic Site.

Today, Keji remains an integral part of the Mi'kmaw culture, helping to connect the stories of this land and its people through a myriad of activities including an immersive and guided experience

learning the ancient craft of canoe building with master Mi'kmaw craftsman, Todd Labrador. Hands-on workshops give a behind the scenes cultural experience on the shoreline of Kejimkujik Lake. Visitors can sip a cup of tea and then try their hand at boiling, stripping, and splitting spruce roots or using a draw knife to make wooden pegs for the gunwales. The opportunity to dive into the living history and the contemporary experience of the Mi'kmaq by participating in the ancient craft of birch bark canoe building is one of a kind!

As evening falls, Keji is proud to be one of Canada's Dark Sky Preserves and the only area designated by the Royal Astrological Society of Canada (RASC)

in Nova Scotia. As the sun sets over the western shores of Kejimkujik Lake, the sky unveils a spectacular panorama of tens of thousands of stars, constellations, galaxies, and planets. Families should plan now to attend this year's Dark Sky weekend scheduled for August 24-25—perfect for stargazers young and old. Don't forget, entry is free for youth 17 and under!

If theatrical performances are more to your liking, don't miss Shalan Joudry's play, *Elapultiek*, offered every Friday night. Combined with regular campfire theatre, storytelling programs, and theatrical night hikes, the guided activity schedule has never been so entertaining!

This year marks a very special anniversary for Keji. The National Park portion of the site turns 50 in 2019! Visitors and campers are invited to help celebrate Keji's 50th with many special events and activities starting with Kejimikujik's Dark as Keji Twilight Party on May 18.

In honour of this milestone, Parks Canada is excited to make some necessary improvements to Jeremy's Bay Campground including replacing washrooms and utilities, refitting the campground's wastewater management facilities and building a new water treatment facility to bring these systems up to required standards. The project will ensure that visitor facilities are designed for a long lifespan, low maintenance, and environmental efficiency. As a result, Jeremy's Bay campground will be closed for the 2020 season, however all day-use area

facilities and backcountry activities and facilities will remain open for experiencing Keji during the closure of the campground.

For those interested in a spectacular coastal experience, don't miss a visit to Kejimikujik Seaside, located in Port Joli, just 90 minutes from the inland part of Kejimikujik. Explore two coastal hiking trails leading to pristine white-sand beaches, astonishing turquoise water, and secluded rocky coves. Discover seals basking in the sun, shorebirds, including the endangered Piping plover, and delicate dune systems—a nature lover's paradise!

Keji Seaside is a day park; campers can reserve sites nearby at the Thomas Raddall Provincial Park in East Port L'Hebert.

sive seacoast adventure and help us protect native species from the invasive European green crab – you can sign up for this “science-tourism” experience on our website. 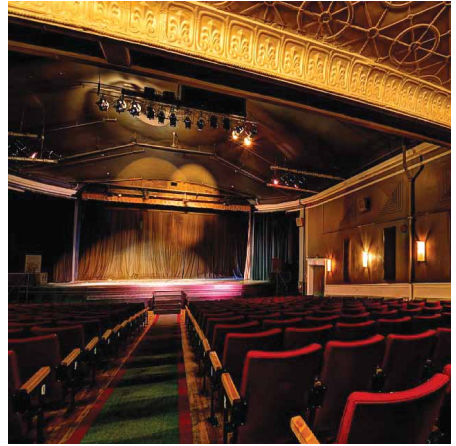

ASTOR THEATRE

Built in 1902 as part of the historic town hall, the theatre was originally known as the Liverpool Opera House. Its stage hosted touring and local shows until 1917, when silent films were introduced. In 1930, talking pictures were shown for the first time. The first “talkie” shown in the theatre was “Love in the Rough,” a comedy on golf. At the same time the name was changed to the Astor Theatre by Seth Bartling Sr. after his favourite theatre in New York.

During World War II the cinema featured regular war documentaries; news reels about the war in Europe became a staple of the Astor’s presentations. Shortly after the war the theatre



was renovated to accommodate more people in the balcony as cinema presentations grew in popularity. A new screen format was installed to allow

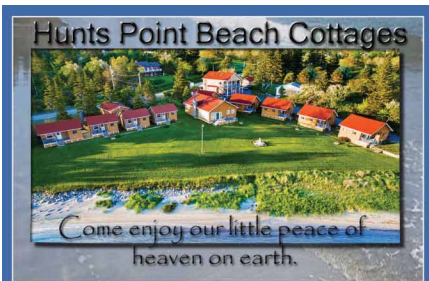
cinemascope pictures in the late '50s. A larger screen was installed and the proscenium arch was widened to allow for the larger pictures. As well, the tin ceiling was plastered over to compensate for amplified sound.

For a time, there were few live presentations. In 1979, with increased interest in live presentation, the Astor began presenting local talent through the Winds of Change Dramatic Society. With the installation of a new thrust stage, the stage area was increased to accommodate larger and larger performing acts. In June 1987, The Astor Theatre Society was incorporated as a non-profit, charitable organization.

The Astor has played host to many touring artists including Matt Ander-

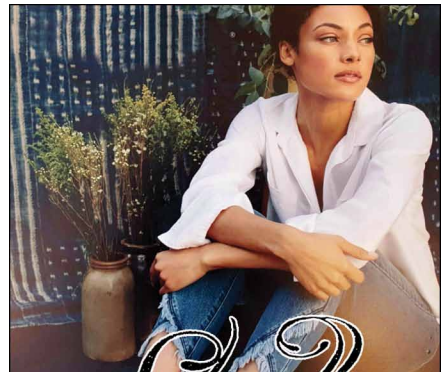

However, the change in the main ceiling did not affect the acoustics which are some of the best in the province.
