

# Watermain Flushing

## REGION OF QUEENS WATER UTILITY

MAY 5 to MAY 9, 2025

Customers are advised that the Water Utility will be flushing watermains from Monday, May 5, 2024, to overnight Friday, May 9, 2025.

Over time, sediment and silt can build up inside the pipes of our water distribution system. Flushing the lines is a preventative measure that helps us to maintain the pipes and the quality of our water. It also helps us to test our water distribution system and ensure everything is working properly.

Throughout the week, customers serviced by the Region of Queens Water Utility can expect to experience a loss of water pressure and discolouration of water until flushing of the entire system is complete. Once flushing is completed, wait 30 minutes, and then run your cold water taps or turn on an outside hose for about 15 minutes or until the water runs clear again. We encourage you to verify the water is clear before using it (cooking, laundry, etc.).
