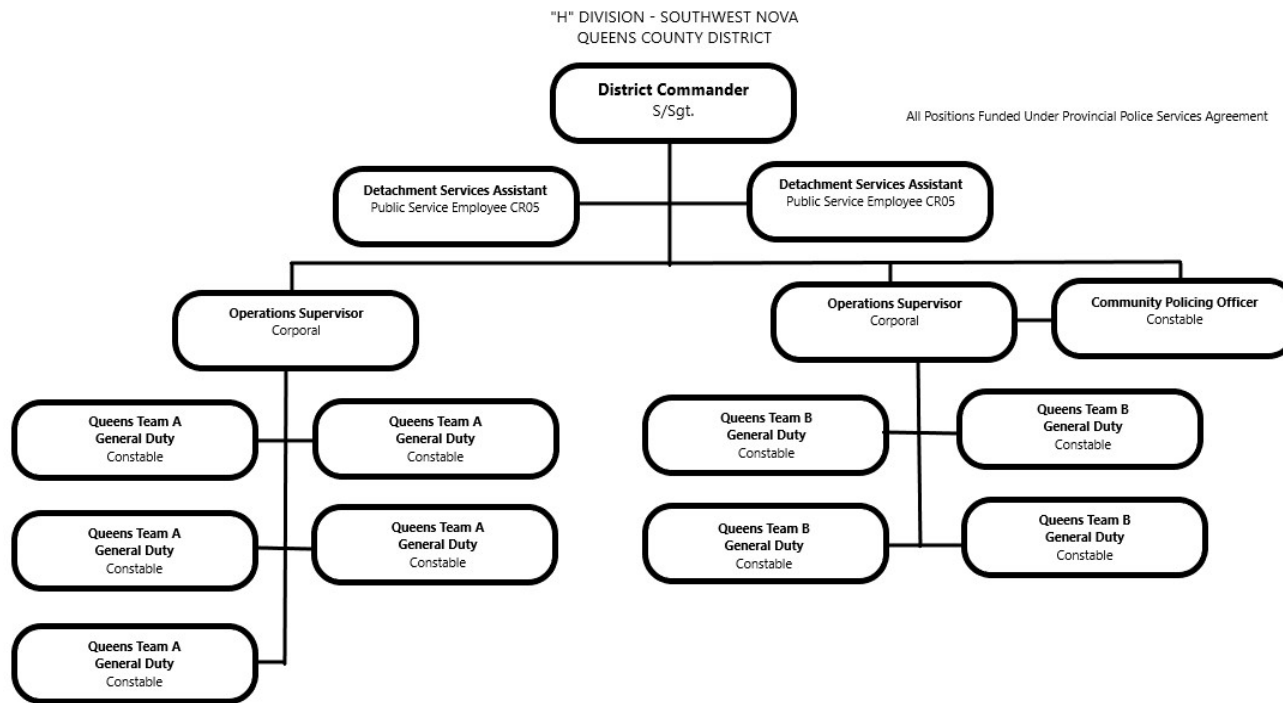

Files marked unfounded and unsubstantiated have been removed. Files marked insufficient evidence to proceed are included.

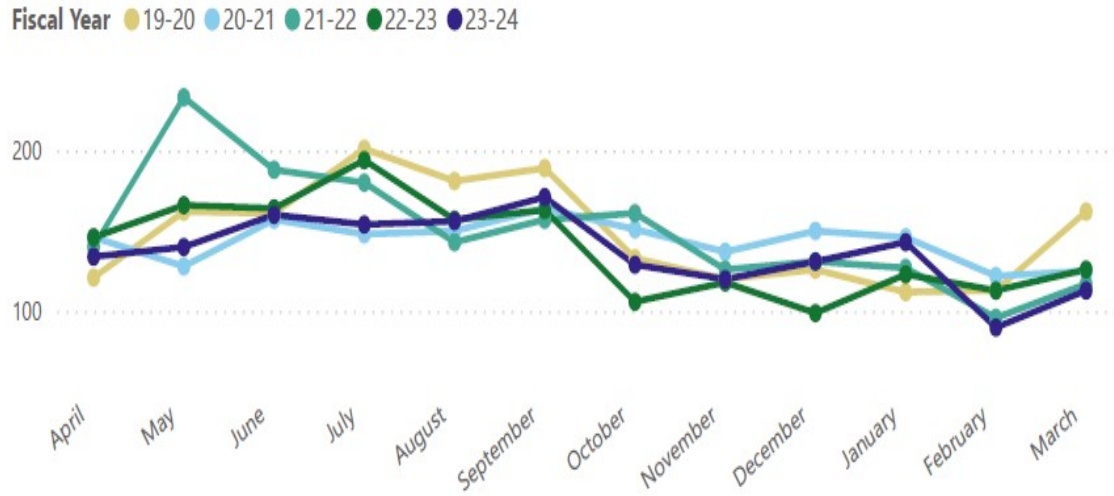

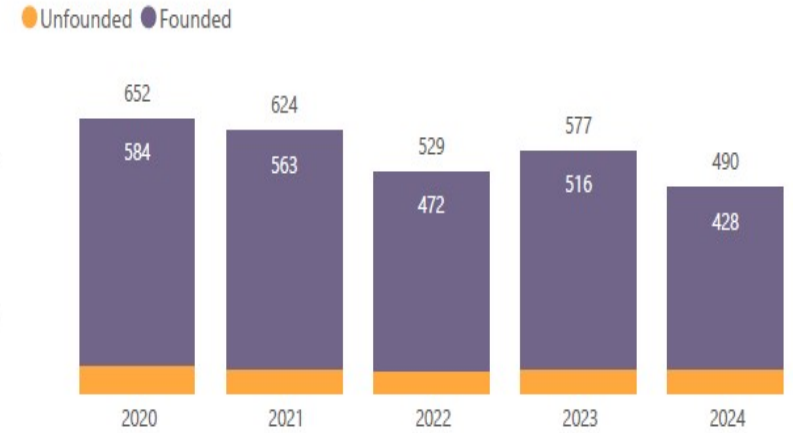

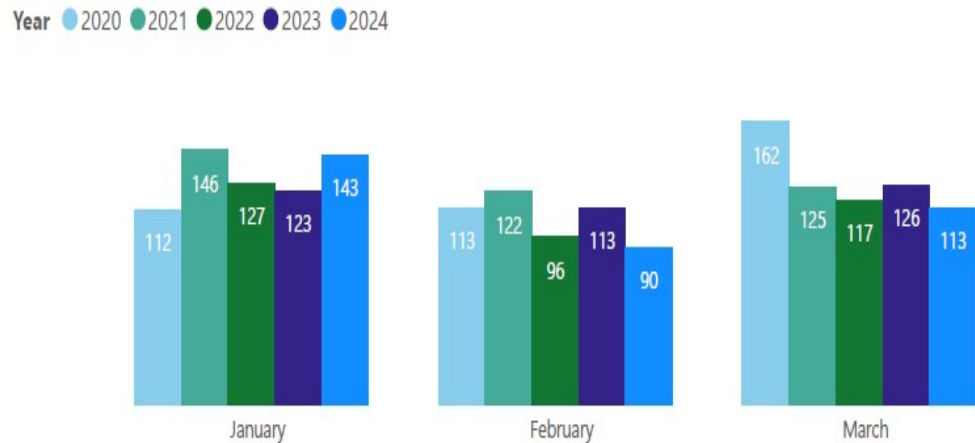
Reported Occurrences (Excluding Traffic)



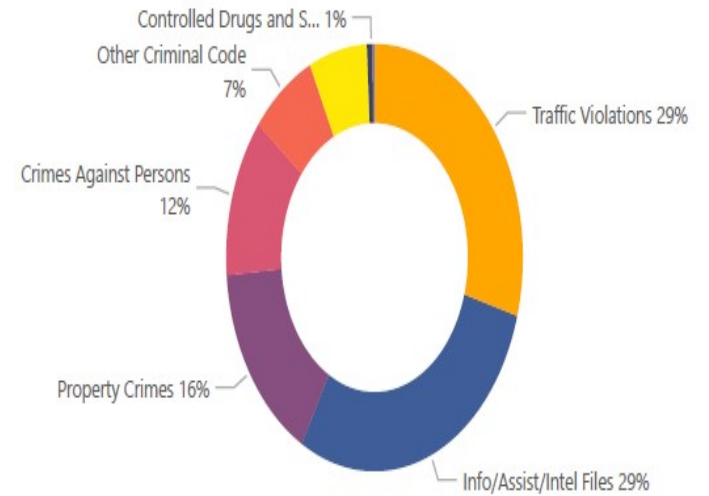
2023-2024 Q4 Reported Occurrences

- Queens District RCMP members conducted ten check stops at various locations throughout Queens County during this quarter.
- Queens District RCMP members issued sixty-one summary offence tickets and twenty-three written warnings during this quarter.
- Queens District RCMP has implemented a strategic check point program to be conducted in high visibility areas throughout the municipality.
- The portable speed radar will be utilized in the upcoming quarter (Q1 2024/2025 Fiscal).

8. COMMUNITY POLICING OFFICER

Cst. Andrew Winsor has remained very active within the Region of Queens Municipality as well as the Schools throughout this reporting period. Cst. Winsor also continues to take on the additional role of general duty policing during HR shortages and short term sick leave.

- Cst. WINSOR has been taking on General Duties throughout this past year in order to alleviate call volumes from the watches during staffing shortages.
- Cst. WINSOR continues to maintain a positive presence within Queens County schools and is responsible for dealing with the majority, if not all of occurrences that originate within the schools as well as regularly participating in "Lock-Down" drills.
- Cst. Winsor conducted a presentation at the DEVI School in Mill Village and discussed drugs and drug safety and the locating of paraphernalia.
- This past quarter, Cst. WINSOR attended a meeting with the MLA and Queens Care Society, meeting with the Minister of Community Services to discuss homelessness within Queens County.
- Cst. Winsor has met with local businesses to discuss shoplifting concerns and solutions.
- Cst. Winsor has met with numerous individuals and has liaised with Harbour House in Bridgewater for possible expansion/satellite location in supporting of womans shelters within Queens County.
- Preliminary planning has taken place with numerous grade schools of a possible tour of RCMP Head Quarters in Dartmouth.
- Cst. Winsor has been sent on the Sexual Assault Investigators training this month as he is often the lead investigator for these types of investigations in his current role.

9. SIGNIFICANT / NOTEWORTHY

Some significant and noteworthy items this past quarter include the following:

- There was one Motor Vehicle Fatality Investigation in January involving a singular ATV Collision on Old Port Mouton Road, Liverpool. Icy road conditions are believed to have contributed to the cause, resulting in the death of a 28 year old man.
- Another Fatal Motor Vehicle Fatality occurred in February on Highway 210 near Buckfield. Icy road conditions are believed to have contributed to the cause, resulting in the death of a 29 year old female.
- A rash of Robberies was solved by Queens District RCMP which included three separate Robberies in Liverpool and one in the Municipality of Lunenburg. A 37 year old Liverpool man and a 33 year old Liverpool woman were charged with numerous counts of Robbery and Disguise with Intent and remain in custody awaiting trial.
- There were six reported break & enters during this quarter. None of which have resulted in charges being laid. Two were unfounded and four resulted in insufficient evidence to proceed.
- There were thirteen shoplifting complaints this quarter.
- Six sexual offenses were reported during this quarter. One of those incidents resulted in charges and another investigation remains ongoing.
- Nineteen Assault investigations conducted this quarter, three of which resulted in charges.
- Members conducted four human death investigations during this quarter, all non-suspicious.
- There were three Missing Person investigations, all in which the subjects were located.
- Members responded to thirty-five calls for service related to individuals experiencing mental health crisis.
- Police have conducted fifty-seven curfew checks this quarter on Court Ordered Offenders in a Crime Reduction Strategy.
- Members responded to forty motor vehicle collisions during this quarter. Two individuals were injured as a result of these collisions and the remaining were property damage. As mentioned, there were two fatalities in the District this quarter due to motor vehicle collisions.
- Police dealt with five incidents of possible impaired driving during this quarter. Charges were laid in one instance.
