What is winter maintenance?

Winter maintenance includes snow removal, anti-icing, and de-icing work that is carried out by Region of Queens Municipality's Department of Infrastructure staff before, during, and after a winter storm. By policy of Council, crews prioritize providing safe routes for emergency vehicles and first responders, balanced with cleaning arterial, collector, and local streets and sidewalks. Staying informed about winter service levels helps everyone stay prepared, safe, and realistic about travel during the winter season.

Service Area

During Storm

Time to Bare Surface (from end of storm)

Arterial Streets & Sidewalks

Heavily travelled roads to move between frequently accessed areas and the highway

Examples: Main St., School St., Bristol Ave., Waterloo St., Henry Hensey Dr., White Point Rd.

Both street lanes & sidewalk maintained but may be snow covered

12 hours

Collector Streets & Sidewalks

Roads that connect to arterial roads to move traffic around the community

Examples: Union St., Old Port Mouton Rd., Payzant St., Church St.

Single street lane plowed. Street and sidewalk may be snow packed

48 hours

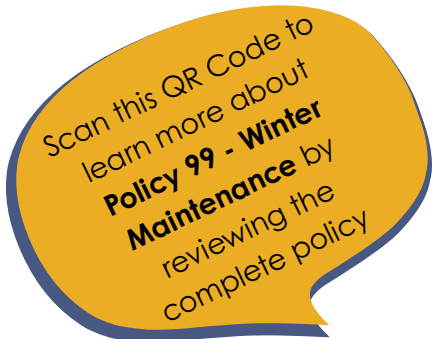
Local Streets & Sidewalks

Less-travelled roads that prioritize traffic to residential areas

Examples: Mersey Ave., James St., King St., Zwicker Ave., Birch Ave.

Generally snow packed.
